S.St	Theme: "A Journey of Discovery: Exploring History, Geography, and Democracy" 1. <b>History</b> – Nationalism in Europe: A Visual Story (Roll No. 1 to 7) Project: "Timeline Wall Art" Create a "Timeline Wall Poster" depicting key events of Nationalism in Europe (such as the Revolutions of 1848, Italian and German Unification, the role of figures like Mazzini, Bismarck, and Garibaldi). Use different art forms (drawing, collage, photo cutouts, digital art) to make this timeline. Each event must include: A visual representation (map, flag, leader's image). A short description (2-3 sentences) explaining the event's significance. Create "Event Cards" to explain the causes, key figures, and impact of each major event. 2. <b>Geography</b> – Mapping India's Resources with a Personal Touch (Roll no. 8 to 14) Activity: "My Resource Adventure" Draw a detailed "Resource Map of India" marking key natural resources (water, soil, minerals, forests, etc.). For each resource, write a personal reflection: How does this resource impact you personally? (e.g., water – your daily use or local water conservation efforts). What steps can you take to conserve this resource in your community? Transform the map into an interactive element: Use colored markers or digital tools (Canva, Google Maps) to represent the resources and include QR codes linking to relevant videos/articles. Create a Resource Journal documenting a local resource in your community and how it's used. Include interviews with local residents or experts. 3. <b>Civics</b> – Power Sharing in Action: A Role-Play Project (Roll no.15 to 20) Activity: "Create Your Democracy" Imagine a fictional country with multiple ethnic, religious, and cultural communities. Create a "Constitution for a New Democracy" that ensures power-sharing among these groups. Draw a "Constitution Cover" with symbols representing equality and justice. Write 3-5 laws ensuring power-sharing, focusing on local autonomy, fair elections, equal representation, and conflict resolution. 4. <b>Economics</b> – Smart Economy: Budget Your Future (Roll no. 21 to 24) Activity: "My Future City Budget" Design a "Future City Budget Plan" focusing on sustainable development. Include key sectors like health, education, transport, energy, and employment. Draw a "City Blueprint" showing how each sector is allocated resources. Use a 3D model, digital tools, or hand-drawn illustrations. Create a Poster on Smart Economy highlighting: The importance of saving, investing, and smart spending. Offer tips for responsible budgeting and sustainability. Add real-life examples of smart economic decisions (e.g., companies, government policies). Host a mock City Planning Meeting with friends or family where you present your future city's budget and discuss how resources can be distributed fairly. Include drawings, newspaper clippings, maps, and even small souvenirs from places you visit or ideas you encounter.
